Facilitating Freight Growth of Indian railways

n efficient supply chain Amanagement requires a coordinated and integrated logistics system. The increased adoption of railways as a mode for cargo movement is crucial for improving India's logistics services. Currently, the modal mix in terms of freight movement is considerably skewed towards road transport with 60 to 65 percent of transport happening via road compared to 25 to 30 percent in developed countries. Indian Railways faces several infrastructural, operational, and connectivity challenges leading to a shift of freight traffic to roads. Research studies suggest that it takes approximately 2-3 days longer for transportation via rail than the road along the major routes leading to higher costs.

To increase the domestic rail share and improve efficiency, the private sector can play an important role in enhancing operational efficiency and strengthening the rail infrastructure. Operational efficiency for loading/unloading, warehousing management, station services, automation, and digitization of various processes could be outsourced to the private

tor as a single point of contact for customers to handle multiple legs of movement and ensure smooth transportation of goods. Increased investment on upgrading basic terminal infrastructure and rolling stock such as movable ramps, trailers, uniform flooring, service facilities for the safety of goods, etc. These reforms will address some of the major challenges faced by the Indian Railways to ensure seamless rail freight operations, increase the share of rail freight in the modal mix, and subsequently, increased revenues for railways.





Then look no more as this Vizag based start-up might just be the place you have been looking for.

Swapnow is a food startup that is working towards making healthy food affordable and accessible.

'Give us your diet plan and Concentrate on Your Workouts More Efficiently' said Mr Praveen founder of Swapnow.

Being a fitness enthusiast himself he noticed that an effective exercise regime calls for a good customized food plan which is typically not found in restaurant menus. It is here that the idea struck him to start out on this venture.

Swapnow offers its customers a range of healthy/ diet oriented menus one can choose from. There are about 80 standardized items on the menu ranging from brown rice meals boxes to different kinds of salads.

'These are nutritionally balanced meals wherein the average price of a meal is Rs 150 and is good for one person' informed Mr Praveen.

And if customers want a customized diet plan they can then opt for a monthly subscription plan.

Their monthly subscription plans vary from Rs 7000 to Rs 15000 depending on the number of meals.

As of now the startup claims to have got 1500 subscriptions through their website and states to deliver 500 to 600 meals per day.

One can either order through food apps such as Swiggy and Zomato or Swapnow can deliver to you directly too.

With 3 outlets, 2 in Vizag and 1 in Hyderabad Swapnow is planning on coming out with 2 more outlets in Hyderabad very soon.

The start-up is also working on getting out an app which they say will be ready in about 6 months to a year time.

Navy gets MH-60R Helicopters


