coal mine auction of the Ministry of Coal wherein twelve states are to benefit directly from auctioning of 141 coal mines.

As per the ministry of coal 133 coal mines were put up for auction in the 6th round of commercial auctions, out of which 71 are new coal mines and 62 coal mines are rolling over from earlier tranches of commercial auctions.

Additionally, 8 coal mines under 2nd attempt of 5th round of commercial auctions were included for which single bids were received in the first attempt. With the launch of this auc-

The mines being auctioned are spread across coal/lignite bearing states of Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Bihar.

Addressing the function Coal, Mines & Parliamentary Affairs minister Mr Pralhad Joshi said that Coal Ministry is exploring alternative methodology for enhanced use of coal. He said that finance ministry has extended Rs. 6000

crore incentive for coal gasification and Rs. 250 crore for exploration process. During the biggest auction un-

dertaken so far, 141 mines pertaining to 11 states have been auctioned. Mr Joshi said that previously auctioned mines have started production and hoped that 10 to 15 million ton coal will be produced from new mines by next year. As per the review done the Ministry of Coal is anticipating 900 million ton coal production this year.



The Hon'ble Supreme L Court of India in the case of UOI Vs M/s. Filco Trade Centre **Private Limited 2022** (63) G.S.T.L. 162 (S.C.) permitted the taxpayers for Filing/revising FORM (Trans-1) for availing the Transitional Credits.

Tax Credit on the pre-text that they can go for VAT **Refund**. However due to scarcity of the funds with the AP Govt they have not got such refunds.

2)Many of VAT Dealers like automobile show rooms, they have not availed the Excise Duty credit involved on the avail the VAT Input Credit on the closing stock of goods.

The GST was implemented from 01st July **2017**. As on 30.06.2017, there were closing balances of unutilized VAT, Excise Duty and Service Tax Input Credits laying in books of accounts of the Taxpayers. For carry forwarding of such closing input tax credits into GST Credit Ledger, Section 140 of the GST Act, 2017 prescribed the form Trans-01 and time limit to file the Form was **27.12.2017**. However large number of taxpayers faced technical/ teething problems in the GSTN Portal while filing the Form Trans-1 & could not submit. Some

glitches got the part of the Input Tax Credit into their ledger instead of full amount. Some entities were not even aware of this facility & thereby lost the credits.

Several appeals were filed before the Supreme Court praying for one more opportunity for availing the Transitional Credits. On this background, hon'ble Supreme Court generously gave the green signal for availing the Transitional Credits.

Who can avail the benefit of the judgment of Supreme Court: -

Some taxpayers 1) have not availed the VAT closing balance of Input closing stock of goods as on 30th June 2017.

3)Even if there is no Excise Duty paying document, the VAT dealers can avail the deemed credit.

4)Construction/Infra Companies also entitled to avail Excise Duty credit involved on the closing stock of goods like steel, cement & iron e.t.c as on 30th June 2017.

5)Any service tax paid reverse charge after GST implementation can also explore the opportunity to file Trans-1. 6)Construction/Infra Companies who were under the Composition Scheme under the VAT Regime, they can also


OPark a women Entrepreneurs Park is likely to come up in Visakhapatnam said Minister for IT and Industries Mr. Gudivada Amarnath.






